

Download Managing Ethnic Conflict In Africa: Pressures And Incentives For Cooperation

This article systematically examines the varying effectiveness of African and non-African third parties in mediating civil wars in Africa. The Angolan Civil War (Portuguese: Guerra civil angolana) was a civil conflict in Angola, beginning in 1975 and continuing, with interludes, until 2002. Fig. 2 presents the structure of local non-tax revenue aggregated for the period 2002 to 2007. Small business revenues and licenses contributes the highest share of local non-tax revenue at more than 26%, while revenue from rental lease account only 5.36%.
